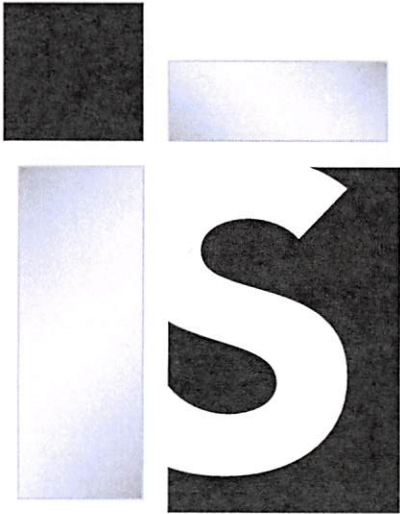



WHEREAS, refugees do not choose to leave their homes, but are forced to flee from persecution and terror in their native countries; and


WHEREAS, it is the goal of South Salt Lake and its many partners to provide critical services to newly arrived refugees and help them become self-sufficient; and

WHEREAS, as a city, we must continue to uphold the tradition of offering assistance and creating pathways to those who are most vulnerable and persecuted in this world; and


WHEREAS, South Salt Lake is a city made up of and proud of our great diversity, and welcomes immigrants and refugees from all over the world.






